

Ordering a vaccination certificate – if you do not have a registered address in Sweden

By signing this form, you consent to the Swedish eHealth Agency obtaining information about your vaccination from the Public Health Agency of Sweden. You can request the certificate no earlier than seven (7) days after being vaccinated.

NB! Use this form only if you do not have a registered address in Sweden.

If you have a registered address, we will send the certificate to that address.

1. Complete and sign the form. In the identity number field, enter your personal identity number, coordination number or immunity number – a reserve number (temporary medical number) cannot be used.

3. We will send your vaccination certificate by registered mail to a service point. You will get a notification from PostNord when you can pick up your letter.

Consent (mandatory)

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Processing of personal data for vaccination certificate

In accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), this information is intended to provide an overview of how the Swedish eHealth Authority, as data controller, processes your personal data when you apply for a vaccination certificate, and what rights you have.

The vaccination certificate is intended to make it easier to travel within Europe during the Corona pandemic. The certificate is designed the same way throughout the EU, Norway, Iceland, Switzerland and Liechtenstein. The vaccination certificate is issued by the Swedish eHealth Agency.

You can use the vaccination certificate as proof that you have been vaccinated against COVID-19.

As a parent or guardian, you can obtain a vaccination certificate for your child. Children can collect vaccination certificates themselves from the age of 16.

How do we process your personal data?

When you submit a form to the Swedish eHealth Agency requesting a vaccination certificate, the form and the resulting certificate will be saved. This is done pursuant to the provisions on the handling of official documents in Chapter 2 of the Freedom of the Press Act (1949:105) and the Archives Act (1990:782). The information you provide on the form serves as the basis for issuing your vaccination certificate. We also use your personal data to compile statistics on vaccination certificates ordered. However, for such statistical purposes, the data is processed only in aggregate form or in a form that cannot identify you as an individual. We keep your personal data for as long as we need it to fulfil the purpose, or as long as required by law.

Our legal basis for the processing of personal data is that the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest. The processing of personal data is supported by provisions of Regulation (EU) 2021/953 of the European Parliament and of the Council, and by the complementary Swedish Regulation (2021:708) on digital COVID certificates.

Employees who need to process the data in order to perform their duties may access your personal data.

What are your rights?

You have the right to obtain information about and access to the personal data that the Swedish eHealth Agency processes about you, free of charge. You also have the right to receive a copy of that information.

We will, at your request or on our own initiative, correct or delete data that is inaccurate or restrict the processing of such data. You have the right to object to the processing of your data. You also have the right, in certain cases, to receive your personal data in a machine-readable format or to have the data transferred to a third party you designate, if technically feasible.

If you are not satisfied with our processing, you have the right to complain to the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection (IMY) (<https://www.imy.se/>), the supervisory authority for the processing of personal data in Sweden.

You can also contact the supervisory authority in the country where you live or work. You have the right to seek damages if your personal data is processed unlawfully.

Information regarding secrecy

In addition to information on how the Swedish eHealth Agency processes your personal data, the Agency is also required to inform you about how your information is processed when classified as secret. This is done pursuant to the Swedish Regulation (2021:708) on digital COVID certificates. This regulation complements Regulation (EU) 2021/953 of the European Parliament and of the Council.

The Swedish eHealth Agency obtains information about your vaccination from the national vaccination register of the Public Health Agency of Sweden. This is done so that the Agency can issue a vaccination certificate to you.

The data in the national vaccination register is subject to secrecy pursuant to Chapter 24, Section 8 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (2009:400). The level of secrecy here is very high. When you request and consent to obtaining a vaccination certificate, you are exempting this data from secrecy, thereby enabling the Swedish eHealth Agency to obtain data about your vaccination and issue a vaccination certificate to you. When the data is processed by the Swedish eHealth Agency, it is subject to secrecy pursuant to Chapter 25, Section 17 a of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act.
